### May 6<sup>th</sup> Meeting:


Lion Tom Langhals President and Owner of Colonial Surface Solutions and Diamond Manufacturing of Bluffton presented the program "The Challenges of Business". Tom spoke of his growing up year in the Columbus Grove area...his time in US military as a Marine, returning home to start farming, then starting a painting business that later became Colonial Surface Solutions. As the business grew in rural



Columbus Grove, space became an issue resulting in the purchase of the former Mid-Bus manufacturing building, and later with the purchase of Diamond Manufacturing it was moved into the new building. Over a period of time, new ventures were added resulting in the need for additional space. Later, with more growth in his business, there was a need to expand again, resulting in the purchase of the Triplett Corporation property in Bluffton. Tom also shared about the many challenges faced as the companies continued to grow.

## May 20<sup>th</sup> Meeting:

Dr. Mark Yoder spoke to the noon Lions meeting about Diseases of the Eye as We age. He presented the mission of the Lions Sight Preservation, Awareness and Action Program which is: to provide programs and assistance to aid people who have partial or complete loss of sight and to work to eliminate preventable and reversible blindness. He spoke briefly about his role working with the underserved and preventable blindness in Haiti and the Dominican Republic. Dr. Yoder discussed the various diseases



that we can develop and stressed the importance of yearly eye exams. Eye diseases can be determined by the limit of vision that one experiences, whither lack of peripheral vision, blurring of vision, or other symptoms. By having a yearly eye exam, these diseases can be determined early and cared for to help prevent further vision loss. The Bluffton Lions club assists in awareness through diabetic education, collecting glasses and volunteering at the eyeglass sorting center to meet our Lions mission. Plan to join in on June 3<sup>rd</sup> at the VOSH-Oh sorting center in the Pandora Methodist Church.
