#### **Ordinance Committee Minutes**

Village of Bluffton

TOPIC: Public Hearing: Accessory Dwelling Units (ADU)

- •Committee members made the power-point presentation of the ADU ordinance. This included definition and examples of ADUs in urban development. We addressed reasons ADUs serve the needs of elderly, moderate income folks, and sustainability in the Village infrastructure. Some description of our research and the legislation proposed were included in the presentation. Then we listened.
- •Most of the feedback from the public was cautionary or negative to the changes proposed. There was a special concern about absent ADU owners. An example given by one person recounted their rental house in another town, where the tenant did extensive damage to the property without the landlord's knowledge. Another was concerned that an ADU designed for 1-3 persons might be occupied by 20 persons from another culture (Haitian) without the owner's knowledge. One person stated that the changes were "fundamental" and would risk negative effects in the R-1 districts. It was proposed that with no change to our zoning ordinance Bluffton residents could simply ask for a change of zoning status to R-2 which would allow multi-family, and therefore ADU construction.
- -Another person felt that the onset of ADUs would diminish the demand for nursing home care by allowing elders to remain in their homes longer. This would likely spell the demise of a third major Bluffton institution, Mennonite Memorial Home; the other two institutions in decline being the hospital and the university/college.
- •The committee and staff thanked the public attendees for their presence and for sharing their perspectives in response to the ADU proposal by this committee.
