Village of Bluffton Finance Committee Meeting November 8, 2024 @ 12:30 PM

Committee member present, David Steiner, and Phil Talavinia Mayor Richard Johnson Staff present, Jesse Blackburn, Village Administrator, Kevin Nickel, Fiscal Officer and Ryan Burkholder Police chief

The committee reviewed the temporary appropriations for 2025 and recommends the Council approve them. Final appropriations will be presented to the council for approval in the first quarter of 2025.

The State Auditor's office pointed out that there are old debt service funds for pool capital improvements and various street projects that should be transferred to the appropriate funds because the associated debt has been paid. The committee recommends that legislation be prepared to accomplish the recommendation.

The Village Administrator informed the committee of a funding gap in the Park Fund. The current park development project has presented a need for \$105,000 to be added to the Park Fund for the following:

- 1. Purchase of 5-acres of land from Greg Muller to use for a public park (\$50,000)
- 2. The purchase, transport and graded placement of 7" of stone for the driveways and parking lots of the park (\$55,000)

The committee recommends that legislation be prepared to make a \$105,000 transfer from the General Fund to the Park Fund.

AN ORDINANCE ACCEPTING A PETITION FROM JOHN, ANNA, JERRY & DAVID BLANKEMEYER, TIMOTHY & NATASHA MARTIN, SUKHDEV SINGH AND CARRIE HARPER, ANNEXING TERRITORY FROM ORANGE TOWNSHIP, HANCOCK COUNTY, OHIO TO THE VILLAGE OF BLUFFTON, OHIO PURSUANT TO OHIO REVISED CODE SECTION 709.04 AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS: A petition for annexation of territory was filed with the Commissioners of Hancock County, Ohio on May 28, 2024 and the Commissioners of Hancock County, Ohio approved such petition by resolution #52-24 dated August 15, 2024, and;

WHEREAS: Sixty days have expired from the date of delivery of a certified copy of the entire record of the annexation proceedings, including all resolutions of the board, signed by a majority of the members of the board, the petition, map, and all other papers on file, and the recording of the proceedings, to the clerk of the Village of Bluffton, Ohio pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 709.022 and 709.04, and;

WHEREAS: An emergency exists in that the annexation of this property is required for the development of transportation improvements that will create safe and timely ingress and egress from S.R. 103 to Navajo Drive and provide a business climate that will encourage future investment of facilities and jobs in this area.

WHEREAS: The Village of Bluffton, Ohio accepts the said territory into the Village of Bluffton, Ohio.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF BLUFFTON, OHIO THAT:

SECTION 1: That the petition for the annexation is hereby accepted by the Council of the Village of Bluffton, Ohio pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 709.04.

SECTION 2: That the following described territory in Exhibit A is hereby annexed to and made a part of the Village of Bluffton, Ohio and shall be and remain under its jurisdiction as part of the municipal corporation of the Village of Bluffton hereafter.




