Co-op Garden Tour:

Our meeting this month is going to be a tour, Tuesday 6:30 p.m. July 7th at the "Co-op Garden" that is on Ray Person's farm. Ray gave a good presentation at our April meeting on the co-op garden that he started. It all basically began with the inspiration to have control over what and how the members want to grow for food and the desire to have as little detriment on the land as possible. The co-op started with a group that wanted to try to work together to make a difference in how they take care of the land. If you use the land properly it can sustain a healthy source of food without the use of sometimes harmful chemicals.

The co-op garden has twenty garden plots with each plot containing a crop or several that grow good together. They practice crop rotation so that they can help to keep the soil healthy and can somewhat control any possible disease problems that some of the plants have a tendency towards. This also means that no crop is planted in the same plot for two years in a row.

They also have free range chickens for eggs and meat and pigs, sheep and goats. If you weren't there you missed a good one.

We will leave the library parking lot at 6:00 p.m. and should arrive at the co-op garden on Putnam Rd/Rd R by 6:15 p.m. If you know where it is you can meet us at Ray's farm by 6:30. If you know of someone that would like to join us on this tour please invite them.


