



After supper, Bill lead us in singing, "Happy Birthday" and "Happy Anniversary" to the ones who were celebrating. Tonya interviewed Helen Milan, who was celebrating her 90th birthday and presented her with a red rose and her Life Membership. After the announcements, Tonya lead everyone in children's games. First was "Button, Button, who's got the Button?" Some people found the button easily and some couldn't. Next, we played the chocolate game. People had to open the chocolate bar and eat it with gloves on. Next was "hot potato" and last but not least, we played "Simon Says." There was much laughter so we think there was a good time by all.

BLACK HILLS and MT. RUSHMORE

Well, May 31st finally arrived for the start of our trip to the Black Hills of South Dakota. Thirty-three(33) seniors met in the parking lot behind the Center loading their luggage and getting their name tags. Bob and Bev welcomed everyone aboard the bus which was going to be our "vehicle" for 9 days/nights. At 7:05 a.m., we headed north on I-75 going to I-80 West for Chicago, Il.. Arrived in downtown Chicago in time for lunch where we found a food court in Macy's. Pat & Harlan Basinger had been there before and led the group to the area which had several choices. When done eating, one had some time to shop a little or just look around the very, very, large store. Keith and I checked out the Lego Store and American Doll store. We did some Christmas shopping for our three grandchildren and can hardly wait to give them the gifts. Ha! Met the bus across the street from Macy's and headed to Union Station (railroad station) to meet a "step-on guide" for the afternoon. Our bus driver, Mathis, did an "excellent" job driving around all the construction on the streets let alone all the traffic in the area, people and vehicles. The guide mentioned that Chicago is the 2nd largest city in the U.S.A. with Los Angles being 1st; Chicago's population is about 2 million & 700 thousand plus suburbs which totaled around 9 ½ million people total. President Obama lives in Kenwood (a suburb) when in Chicago which we just drove through and a little disappointed. Other facts of town are: 1871 Chicago had a serious fire; 1893 World's Fair held here; 26 miles of lake front on Lake Michigan with 30 beaches all inside the U.S. border, 77 different neighborhoods; about 55 trains a day out of Union Station; and in 1930, Louie Armstrong brought Jazz to 35th street. Last, Trump Tower is the 2nd tallest building in Chicago with staying in rooms: (1 night) \$500 a night! A condo with a 36 degree view, \$12,000 a month. His apartment is on the 89th floor when he is there. Wow!!

Sunday, we left from Mt. Prospect, IL for the Wisconsin Dells. Pat Basinger had a short devotional time for all of us while riding on the bus with singing and some readings from the Upper Room. She reminded all of us that if we just give a "smile" each day to someone we



meet, it just might be the thing that person needs to make it through the day. Arrived at the **Dells** and had lunch and then waited till 2:30 p.m. for our cruise on the lake of the "Lower Dells" because of a rain shower. All aboard and enjoyed a quiet ride looking at the many different designs of rocks. Back at the docks and the rain started again. Checked into the motel and went across the road to the **Paul Bunyan** restaurant. It was a "rustic, homey, chuck wagon " atmosphere. Food was very good and tasty! Several bought souvenirs and then back to our rooms for a good night's sleep.

Monday, ate breakfast, back on the bus, and headed west on I-90 towards Mitchell, So. Dak. It was a long day driving across Minnesota with rest stops about every 2 ½ hours and got to Mitchell a little later than planned to see the Corn Palace, so we just went to the motel.

Tuesday morning, we headed to the Corn Palace early. What a beautiful building! The murals on the outside of the building are known as "folk art" and all are done with corn (12 different shades of corn), prairie grass, wheat, and rye. The Corn Palace is the only one in the world! The murals on the outside were an agricultural theme and so breath taking! More murals inside which were about the American Indians and pioneers in the area. Continued on to the Badlands near Rapid City, So. Dak. Crossing this state, homes were far apart and you might see some cattle out in a large field and maybe a house now and then. Very, very, bare around there and I sure won't like to be living in that area! A sunny afternoon of riding and a few folks took naps or play their iPods or Kindles. We arrived at Badlands National Park, and Mathis, our driver, followed the signs to the entrance and away we went. The road and severely eroded mixed grass prairie seemed to just go on, on, and on, curve here and there, and then finally arrived at the west end of the park. The Badlands are exposed layers of fossilized soils and different rock formations created by erosion from many, many years. Back in civilization again, we checked into our motel for our three day stay in Rapid City. Walked down through the parking lot to The Diner for supper. The restaurant was decorated like back in the 50's and waitresses were the poodle skirts, white blouses, and ribbons in their hair. Really a great setting! When everyone was through, we headed to Keystone to see Mt. Rushmore, for the the night light show. Was sort of sprinkling and cool when we arrived at the mountain with fog moving in. So the light show didn't happen exactly like it was to be. We did see the four men for about 10 minutes (fog lifted) and then fog came back and covered them well. The Forest Ranger still continued with their program and at the end invited Veteran's to come to the stage to honor them for their service. Kathy Hayes, Betty Heldman's daughter, from our group, an ex-Marine, went up with the others. It was nice to have a person in our group that could take part in the program Fog started to lift again as we got closer to Rapid City.

Wednesday, we returned to Mt. Rushmore to see and enjoy the mountain with a very beautiful sunny day. Took a lot of pictures and Keith and I plus others checked out the museum showing tools and other items used to carve out the faces. It was unbelievable that NO one died while working on the mountain, but one man fell and broke some ribs. Got souvenirs and purchased a dish of Thomas Jefferson's vanilla ice cream at the Ice Cream Shop. The recipe was his mother's and was tasty, \$5.00 a dish, it should have been! Ha!! Loaded up and on to see Crazy Horse and eat lunch there at the welcome center. This mountain sculpture isn't done yet, just the head/face with no arm or horse yet! There was a lot of things to see around the mountain with a tour offered to drive close to it. After several hours here looking over the gift shop and items from the American Indians in the area, we went to Custer State Park and Wildlife loop. Saw a lot of bison and new calves, some antelope, and even little prairie dogs. Stopped at Coolidge Inn General Store for a break, an ice cream break, and the group picture was taken. Returned to Rapid City having a full day of educational information about everything we saw. I believe people sure slept good this night too. Ha!




