Yield: 6 to 8 servings

Everyone loves sweet and sour chicken and this colorful entries

- 1 large (approximately 3 pounds) chicken, cut into 8 pieces or 6 boneless skinless chicken breast halves
- 2 bell peppers, roughly chopped
- 2 medium onions, roughly chopped
- 2 cloves garlic, minced or 2 teaspoons chopped garlic
- 1 can (20 ounces) pineapple chunks, drained
- 2 cups bottled barbeque sauce
- 1 teaspoon sliced, pickled jalapenos, optional
- Preheat oven to 375".
- In a large (3-quart) baking dish, combine chicken pieces and remaining ingredients. Bake uncovered for 45 minutes or until largest pieces of chicken are done.

Need: 3-quart baking dish or 9" x 13" baking dish.

Convenience items: Chop vegetables ahead and store in plastic bags in the refrigerator up to 3 days. Replace fresh vegetables with one bag (4 ounces) each, frazen chapped onions and peppers.
