(trip story continues from September letter- Chattanooga, Tenn.)

Its known as the World's Steepest Passenger Railway at a breath taking 72.7% grade straight down or up! The track is almost 1 mile long and a rail car can hold about 36 people. The steel cables each pull 70 tons, each 5,000 feet long and either one is capable of pulling a car up or down if necessary. When one got to the bottom or top, people had to get off and let the other people waiting to get on. When the next car came, then you could get on it and return to top or bottom. It was quite a ride - smooth, slow, and unbelievable!! After gathering everyone back together, and loaded on the bus, we were going to "Ruby Falls" located by Rock City. It is 145 ft tall and known as the world's tallest underground waterfall, a nature wonder! One starts with an elevator ride down 260ft into the cave. A guide leads you through the paths and explains about the different geological formations by the walk way such as: Cactus, candle, Onyx column, frozen nigari, and Ruby's drapery. About in this area you are now 1,120 ft underground (the height of the Empire State building in NY). Temperature always stays in the 60 degrees and no rain inside but places water is running over the rocks. Leo Lambert and a group of fellows crawled into a small opening spending 17 hours on hand and knees before hearing the sound of rushing water. They were awestruck by the waterfall and in honor of his wife, Ruby, 87 years ago. In 1930, the falls were established as a tourist attraction, one of a kind. It takes about 1 hour and 20 minutes to see the cave with the falls going and returning back to the elevator. Back to the bus and for me I was so glad to be outside and above ground and even good to see the cloudy skies. Ha!! Ate supper at Bea's Restaurant in Chattanooga. It is just an old house like (I believe) remodeled in 1950 by a couple and then operated by them and now by the fourth generation. They serve family style with a southern hospitality. They could serve a total of 184 people, with 8 people to the table and have 23 tables. Being round tables with a large lazy susan in the

middle holding the food of several different items. They treated us like they have known us for years and we were just new! If one left feeling hungry, it was their own fault. On the bus going back to the hotel, it was quiet and I'm sure everyone was tired from a very busy day.

Thursday, about 8:30 a.m. departed for Blue Ridge, GA. for a 26 mile round train trip to Murphy Junction along the Toccoa River. We started and ended at McCaysville, GA. (sister city to Copperhill, TN) for about two hours to walk around town. About half way down main street, one can see a Blue Line that crosses the street and in a parking lot of the IGA Grocery Store, you'll see the names of GA and TN on each side of the Blue Line. This is very popular here because people can stand here, one foot on one side and the other foot on the other side and you are in two different states at the same time. Wow !! ( Keith and I stood there like many others and took our picture.) The river that goes through this town has two names: GA. it is Toccoa River and TN. it is Occoe River. In the railroad car, we all switched sides of the car so you could see what you didn't going the other way. Loaded back on the bus (a few quick got themselves some ice cream, yum!) but just glad to head back to Chattanooga for our evening meal on the Southern Belle riverboat. It was served buffet style and when done, one could go and sit outside on the deck to watch the scenery go by. It was beautiful out with NO RAIN and no wind either. Returned back to shore and on the bus and got our suitcases ready for loading at 7 a.m. on Friday morning.

Friday at 8:30 a.m. we were looking at the hotel for our last time and I'm sure some were anxious to getting back to **Bluffton** or wherever home was. The sun was shining and the bus was quiet for about the first two hours. People were just remembering their time here or just tired and sleeping and glad that they weren't driving in all of the TRAFFIC!!! Larry, our driver, sure had the patience and did very well with all the vehicles he dealt with each day. **Bev** had a new game
