>>> 2014 ANNUAL MEETING

The **2014 Annual Meeting** of the BRWP was held on November 19, 2014 at the Hancock Agricultural Center on CR 140. Over 40 people

attended the 7-9 a.m. meeting. The guest speaker for the meeting was Dr. Larry Antosch from the Ohio Farm Bureau. Dr. Antosch spoke on "The Role of the Farm Bureau in Combatting the Algal Bloom in Lake Erie." The BRWP elected representatives to the 2015 Board of Directors representing The Outlet/Lye Creek watershed, Richard Kozlowski, Cranberry Creek watershed, Jeremiah Haselman, and Jane McCleary,



the At-Large #3 position. Phil Martin, watershed coordinator, reviewed the "Happenings from 2014" and gave a preview of 2015. Theresa Allen, vice president of the BRWP, presented awards. Jeff Knedler from Hempy Water Conditioning in Forest received the Annual "Friends of the River" award for continual support of the watershed. Elaine Reynolds received the "Coordinator's Award" for all her volunteer time. Elaine does our GIS work which provides maps for us and she serves on the Education Committee. Congratulations and Thank You to both Jeff and Elaine.



>>> HERE COMES 2015

The BRWP was very active in 2014 and 2015 looks like it will be just as busy and more challenging. Here are some of the projects and / or activities the BRWP will be involved with in 2015.

- ◆ The BRWP is again sponsoring a Rain Barrel Decorating Contest in the area high schools. Twenty five barrels will be on display at the Greater Home Show on February 28th and March 1st at the Findlay Village Mall. Stop and vote for the best barrel. Some of the barrels will be available for sale at the show. (See Picture 1)
- ◆ The BRWP will still have two Great Lakes Commission grants in the Upper Riley Creek and Lower Riley Creek watersheds during 2015. Both grants are for Best Management Practices with the farmers. Picture 2 shows a field of cover crops from 2014.
- The BRWP will continue to have displays at the county fairs (See Picture 3) and at other area locations. The BRWP will also provide a speaker to talk about the importance of great water quality to the economy and the quality of life in an a watershed. If you have a meeting where you need a speaker or a place for our display, please call Phil Martin at 419.422.6487.
- The Chemical testing program with the Sierra Club will start in March. Nearly 80 sites will be tested on a monthly basis from March until October. The testing will be done by trained volunteers. Over 15 stakeholders have been trained. The results will be used to help find areas that are impaired. The BRWP will work in the area to find grant money to do the restoration.
- The BRWP will act as the fiscal agent and will be the project manager for a \$94,000 U.S. Forest Service grant to plant 920 trees in the Village of Ottawa, City of Findlay, and on Hancock Park District property. The trees will replace ash trees lost to the Emerald Ash Borer.
- ◆ The BRWP will continue to do our Water Quality Monitoring during late June and September. We will again monitor 21 sites on the Blanchard River, Lye Creek, Riley Creek, and Little Riley Creek. Volunteers are needed to help. Call Phil Martin at 419.422.6487 if you would like to help.
